**Successful candidates must comply with the following condition**

**1. Successful candidate must end current enrollment status. Any financial obligations associated with current enrollment must be settled before being eligible for re-enrollment.**

**2. To be enrolled as Ph.D. Candidate in Economics**, the candidates must submit:  
(All photocopies of documents must be signed by the applicants)

- 2.1 Two copies of Bachelor degree transcript (s), including graduation certificate;
- 2.2 Two copies of Master’s degree transcript (s), including graduation certificate, In the case of applicant is waiting for the official degree approval with conferred date, applicant is allowed to submit the official transcript (s) with conferred date to NIDA’s Educational Service Division before the first day of the first semester (within August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020);
- 2.3 One copy of a household registration certificate (for Thai citizens);
- 2.4 Two copies of identification cards (for Thai citizens), or passport (for Foreigners);
- 2.5 Medical certificate (Medical Certification is not more than 1 month and show that the students does not suffer the critical illness and prohibited diseases. The student can require from government or private hospital and clinic);
- 2.6 Three 1-inch photo taken no more than six months prior to application date;
- 2.7 If applicable, an official document indicating a name/family name change and a marriage certificate.
- 2.8 All foreign students must have valid health insurance throughout the entire duration of their studies;
- 2.9 Candidates must complete the application form for student ID card is available for download at <http://edserv.nida.ac.th/th/student/freshman>.

In addition, National Institute of Development Administration had delegated Bangkok Bank, NIDA Sub-Branch to issue student ID card. Bangkok Bank will notify the date to receive student ID card and Saving Bank Account later. Student are required to comply with all rules and regulations of the Bank.

1. #### 4. English Proficiency

4.1 Applicants must conform to the requirements of NIDA’s current announcement on English proficiency requirements for the International Program students as follows:

4.1.1 Unless applicants are native English speakers or have obtained their bachelor’s and/or master’s degrees (not more than five years ago) from international academic institutions where English was the medium of communication, they are required to submit a test score of either the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS). The minimum TOEFL score is 550 for the paper-and-pencil test, 213 for the computer-based test or 79 for the internet-based test. For the IELTS, the minimum score is 6.0 points. (TOEFL or IELTS score taken for not more than two years)

4.1.2 Applicants who can be exempted from the requirement in 4.1.1 shall meet one of the following criteria.

1) For those who enter into the Program with Bachelor’s degree qualification, students must have completed a degree in a curriculum taught in English within the past 5 years from the starting date of the semester the students are registered with the Program.

2) For those who enter into the Program with Master’s degree qualification, students must have completed a Master’s degree taught in English within the past 5 years from the starting date of the semester the students are registered with the Program, with a GPA of no less than 3.25.

4.1.3 Applicants who do not meet the minimum requirements of English proficiency tests stipulated by the program, under a condition that the TOEFL minimum score of 550 must be obtained and submitted **within August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020**. Those applicants must register for LC6000 Advanced Reading and Writing in English for Graduate Studies in the first semester of the academic year 2020 and LC4003 Advanced Integrated English Language Skills Development in the second semester of the academic year 2020. For each subject, the applicants must receive a grade not lower than “B”. After the completion of LC6000 & LC4003, the applicants must submit the TOEFL score of 530 paper-based or 193 computer-based or 69 internet-based score or higher, or IELTS score of 5.5 or higher, or NIDA EPT score (English Proficiency Test) of 650 or higher. The scores must not be older than 2 years until the submission date.

4.1.4 Students can graduate from the Program only if their English proficiency meets the following standards

- Students must hold TOEFL 530 paper-based or 193 computer-based or 69 internet-based score or higher, or IELTS score 5.5 or higher, or NIDA EPT score (English Proficiency Test) 650 or higher. Yet, the scores must not be older than 2 years until the submission date.
